Virtual Depositions

- 1. Prepare, Prepare, Prepare
 - Location/Background/Lighting/What to Wear
 - Appropriate Equipment
 - Perform Test

2. Potential Issues

- Attorney/Client Collusion
- Platform Recording of Deposition

3. Tips/Pointers

- Understand/Hear Questions
- Technical Difficulties
- Communication Between Client/Attorney
- Exhibits

Motions & Hearings – How to Keep the Judge's Attention

Court Hearings on Key Motions – Audio, Visual, or Both?

1. <u>Pre-Hearing Tips</u>

- a. Get ready and fully dress like you are going to court
- b. Ensure webcam, audio, and internet connection are functional well before the hearing
 -Consider a non-laptop webcam or headset/separate microphone for sound quality
- c. Turn off webcam filters/distracting backgrounds and do a test run prior to the hearing
- d. Uncluttered background. If necessary-use a virtual office background or bookshelf
- e. No people/pets in background, and minimize any sounds
- f. Connect to Zoom early. You may have to wait for the Court to take you out of a waiting room.



COURT HEARINGS ON KEY MOTIONS – AUDIO, VISUAL, OR BOTH?

- 2. <u>Audio/Telephonic, or Visual Remote Hearings?</u>
- a. Try to opt for visual remote hearings
- b. In-person vs. visual remote hearing which is better?
- 3. Tips During the Hearing
- a. Use two screens if possible (one for hearing, one for cases/briefs/exhibits, etc.)
- b. Keep key cases open on your screen for easy reference
- c. Minimize distractions: clear off desk/close blinds/

d. Watch the judge's reaction while listening to opposing counsel – address issues that judge raises/appeared concerned about

• e. Mute yourself when not speaking, but be prepared to unmute yourself if you need to respond to something right away



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
